We are beginning a new year in kindergarten and gaining independence with our daily routines! Soon we will be introducing students to our new reading program "Journeys" by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt. For the next few weeks we will introduce the letters of the alphabet and the sounds they make with the "Lively Letters" program. We have had lots of fun introducing the "Lively Letters" as a support for reinforcing letter/sound associations. Lively letter coloring sheets will be sent home after students have been introduced to specific letters and their sound stories. Please ask your child to tell you about each letter's story and how it produces sound... ask if the letter is noisy or quiet. Use the cues described at the bottom of the coloring sheet to help your child remember each letter's corresponding sound.

Students enjoy sharing a favorite item, from home, with their classmates!

Communication skills of conversational turn taking are focused on during this activity. Students are also taught how to draw a person with detail!
